

- 5.1 Disassembly Procedures:

Remove the monitor stand base:

- 1. Place the monitor on a soft cloth or cushion.
- 2. Press and hold the stand-release button.
- 3. Lift the stand up and away from the monitor.



Put the monitor on a protective cushion, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 4pcs screws for unlocking mechanisms. Remove DP caps.

(No.1~4 screw size=M4x11; Torque=11±1kgfxcm)



Tear off screen protector, then wedge your fingers between rear cover and the middle bezel on the corners of the top side of the monitor to release the rear cover, then use one hand to press the middle bezel, the other hand to pull up the rear cover in order of arrow preference for unlocking the rear cover.


Lift the rear cover up carefully. Disconnect the joystick key cable from the connector of the interface board, and then remove the rear cover and put it aside for later disassembling.

Use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 2pcs screw for unlocking the key board, then tear off the tapes and release the key board.



Tear off 5pcs aluminum foil, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 2pcs screws for unlocking the fan's cover.










Tear off 2pcs tape, then disconnect the speakers' wire from the connector of the board. Use a Philipshead screwdriver to remove 8pcs screws for unlocking the two speakers, then remove the two speakers from the hooks of the middle frame.








Tear off 2pcs aluminum foil and 2pcs mylar tape and disconnect FFC cable away from the main board, S10 then use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 4pcs screws for unlocking the camera unit.

Tear off 1pcs aluminum foil for uncovering the fan, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 3pcs S11 screws for unlocking the fan with the unit.




Use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 16pcs screws for unlocking the middle frame with the panel, then tear off 3pcs tapes and disconnect fans' wire and touch wire from the connectors, and then remove the fan from the hook of the middle frame.

Use the screwdriver to remove 4pcs screws for unlocking the main bracket with the panel. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 4pcs screws for unlocking the bracket cover, and then remove the bracket cover and put it aside.

(No.1~8 Screw size= M3x4, Torque=5±0.5kgfxcm)



Disconnect the DMIC wire away from the connector of the main board, then lift up and take away the middle frame with front bezel.




Tear off all the tapes for releasing the LED wire and touch wire, then tear off 2pcs rubber pads. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to remove 4pcs screws for unlocking the left and right DMic boards, then tear off the left and right DMIC boards from the middle frame. (No.1~4 screw size=M2x2.4, Torque=1±0.2kgfxcm)







Release the front bezel away from the middle frame, and put the front bezel on a protective cushion, then tear off the black mylar tape and release LED board from the hooks of the front bezel, then release the touch board from front bezel by tearing off the tape.





Take 1pcs power board, take over the board and put it into the bracket chassis, then connect the switch wire to the power board. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 1pcs screw for locking the grounding wire with the bracket.

(No.1 screw size=M4x8, Torque=6±0.5kgfxcm)



Take 1pcs main board, 1pcs 1pcs TBT modular board, then connect the TBT board to the main board.

Connect the TBT board to the main board with 1pcs cable, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 3pcs screw for locking the TBT board with main board.




Take 2pcs EDP cables to connect with the main board, then connect the 2pcs cables of the power board with interface board. Turn over the interface board and locate it to the bracket. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 9pcs screws for locking the interface board and power board.

Take a black mylar to insert the hooks of the bracket to cover the power board.



Panel preparation: Take out 1pcs panel from the carton, remove the protective film, then examine the panel surface according to inspection criteria of the panel. Turn over the panel module to place the screen faced down, paste 1pcs mylar tape on the specific position as the picture below shown.





Move the main bracket chassis close to the panel, then connect the two EDP cables to the connectors of the panel.



Turn over the main bracket chassis and put it on the back of the panel, and then connect two panel lamp cables to the connectors of the board. Take 1pcs sensor board with cable, then tear off release paper and paste it on the correct position of the back of the panel, then connect the cable to the main board.



Take 1pcs front bezel, 1pcs touch board, 1pcs LED board and some essential wires. Locate the LED board into the hooks of the front bezel, then paste 1pcs black mylar to cover the LED board. Connect 1pcs FFC cable to the connector of the touch board, then tear off the release paper of the gum, and then paste the touch board on the correct position of the front bezel.












Take 1pcs middle frame, then move the assembled front bezel close to the middle frame, and thread the touch wire and LED wire through the left and right holes of the middle frame, then assemble the front bezel with the middle frame. Fix the LED wire and touch wire on the middle frame by tearing off tapes.





Take 2pcs DMIC boards(left and right) and some essential wires. Connect the left and right DMIC boards with wires, and tear off release paper and paste the two boards to the hooks of middle frame, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 4pcs screws for locking the Mic boards with middle frame. Paste 2pcs rubber pads on the correct positions of two DMIC boards by tearing off the release papers. (No.1~4 screw size=M2x2.4, Torque=1±0.2kgfxcm)


Move the middle frame with front bezel close to the panel unit, then assemble the middle frame with the panel and connect DMIC wire to the main board.



Take 1pcs bracket cover to assemble with the bracket, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 4pcs screws for locking the cover with the bracket. Use the screwdriver to tighten 4pcs screws for locking the main bracket with the panel.

Paste 2pcs mylar tape to cover the camera unit, then paste 2pcs aluminum foil on the specific position as the picture below shown.



Take two speakers to locate into the probers of the middle frame, then connect the two speakers wires and fix the wire on the frame with 1pcs acetate tape. Connect the speaker wire to the main board and fix with 1pcs tape. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 8pcs screws for locking two speakers.




Connect 2pcs wires to 1pcs USB board, the locate the USB board into 1pcs bracket. Use a Philipshead screwdriver to tighten 1pcs screws for locking the USB unit and wire with the bracket. Take 1pcs cover to assemble with USB unit, and then fix the wires with 2pcs tapes as the picture below shown. (No.1 screw size=M3x5, Torque=4±0.5kgfxcm)





Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 1pcs screw for locking the wire of USB unit with main bracket, then locate the USB unit to the hooks of middle frame, connect the wires to the main board, then paste 1pcs mylar tape to fix the FFC connector. Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 4pcs screws for locking the USB unit with middle frame.

(No.1 screw size=M3x6, Torque=5±1kgfxcm; No.2~5 screw size=M3x4, Torque=3.5±0.5kgfxcm)



Take 1pcs fan's cover to assemble with the fan, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 2pcs screws for locking the fan's cover with the middle frame. Paste 5pcs aluminum foil on the specific positions to cover the wires and bracket as the picture below shown.

Take 1pcs joystick key and 1pcs OSD board, assemble the joystick key with the OSD board. Locate the board to the correct position of the rear cover, then use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 2pcs screws for locking the board with rear cover, then paste1pcs conductive foam on the board. Tear off the tape papers on the back of the cable, and then fix the key cable with tapes.

(No.1~2 screw size=M2x3.3, Torque=0.9±0.1kgfxcm)







Move the assembled rear cover close to the panel unit, then connect the joystick key cable to the connector of main board.



Put down the rear cover and push the rear cover on the positions marked for mechanisms engagement.

Use a Philips-head screwdriver to tighten 4pcs screws for locking the rear cover with the unit. Paste 1pcs label on the correct position of the rear cover, then take a stand base close to assemble with the monitor.

Troubleshooting


MARNING: Before you begin any of the procedures in this section, follow the Safety Instructions.

Self-test

Your monitor provides a self-test feature that allows you to check whether your monitor is functioning properly. If your monitor and computer are properly connected but the monitor screen remains dark, run the monitor self-test by performing the following steps:

- 1. Turn off both your computer and the monitor.
- 2. Unplug the video cable from the back of the computer. To ensure proper Self-Test operation, remove all digital and the analog cables from the back of computer.
- **3.** Turn on the monitor.

The floating dialog box should appear on-screen (against a black background), if the monitor cannot sense a video signal and is working correctly. While in self-test mode, the power LED remains white. Also, depending upon the selected input, one of the dialogs shown below will continuously scroll through the screen.



- **4.** This message also appears during normal system operation if the video cable is disconnected or damaged.
- **5.** Turn off your monitor and reconnect the video cable; then turn on both your computer and the monitor.

If your monitor screen remains blank after you use the previous procedure, check your video controller and computer, because your monitor is functioning properly.

abnormality you are experiencing is an inherent problem with your monitor, or with your computer and video card.





To run the built-in diagnostics:

- 1. Ensure that the screen is clean (no dust particles on the surface of the screen).
- **2.** Press and hold Up or Down or Left or Right direction for four seconds until a menu appears on the screen.
- **3.** Using the joystick control, highlight the Diagnostics option and press the joystick button to start the diagnostics. A gray screen is displayed.
- 4. Observe if the screen has any defects or abnormalities.
- 5. Toggle the joystick once again until a red screen is displayed.
- 6. Observe if the screen has any defects or abnormalities.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6 until the screen displays green, blue, black, and white colors. Note any abnormalities or defects.

The test is complete when a text screen is displayed. To exit, toggle the joystick control again.

If you do not detect any screen abnormalities upon using the built-in diagnostic tool, the monitor is functioning properly. Check the video card and computer.

Common Problems

The following table contains general information about common monitor problems you might encounter and the possible solutions:
